- Coordinate participant celebrations-program completion, birthdays, graduations, and holidays, etc.
- Assist in coordinating organizational fundraising events
- Coordinate with donors and volunteers for collecting donations and holiday gift giving drives
- Enter daily events in daily log, as needed

Lampstand Logistics:

- Coordinate seasonal decorations of The Lampstand
- Coordinate with staff in sending notes of gratitude to donors & volunteers
- Monitor & distribute graduation and birthday gifts to participants
- Monitor, distribute, and log in-kind donations
- Collect data and complete monthly & quarterly reports sent to HR Manager
